VA Awards \$188 Million in Grant Funding to Help Homeless Veterans

WASHINGTON — Today, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced \$188 million in grants for two programs benefiting homeless Veterans.

The grants were made through the Grant and Per Diem (GPD) program, awarded to community agencies providing services to homeless Veterans.

Awards announced today will provide approximately \$185 million in per diem funding for 556 projects to community agencies that provide transitional housing and supportive care for homeless Veterans. Awards were made to programs in 49 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

In addition, approximately \$3 million in grant funding will be awarded to 13 community agencies that provide services for homeless Veterans with special needs. The GPD Special Need funding provides additional operational costs for transitional housing and services for homeless Veterans who fall under “Special Need” populations, including women, those with chronic mental illness and individuals who care for minor dependents.

“The GPD program has been instrumental in providing needed services to community organizations,” said VA Secretary Dr. David J. Shulkin. “We look forward to our continued partnership with the awardees as we work together to end Veteran homelessness. Our goal is to help give at-risk Veterans stable housing and a good start to independence.”

Since the GPD program began awarding grants in 1994, approximately \$2 billion has been awarded to community organizations serving homeless Veterans. The complete list of awardees may be found at <https://www.va.gov/homeless/gpd.asp>

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TRC Changes Eligibility for 2017 BMOP Competition and Announces Two New Contest Categories

Thermostat Recycling Corp. (TRC) is switching things up with its 2017 Big Man On Planet (BMOP) competition.

“Now in our sixth year, we’re creating greater excitement by expanding the BMOP playing field,” said Ryan Kiscaden, TRC’s Executive Director. “For the first time ever, we’re automatically enrolling all TRC HVAC wholesale distributors who are also members of HARDI.”

TRC runs its annual BMOP competition in partnership with Heating, Air-conditioning and Refrigeration Distributors International (HARDI). Event organizers decided on the new protocol so more of their collection network could be recognized for their efforts in diverting mercury from the waste stream.

“By making every TRC/HARDI wholesale distributor eligible for the title, our previous champions are going to have to work extra hard to stay on top,” said Kiscaden. Participants who signed up, on their own, before the June 30th deadline, and have promoted the contest internally, are now eligible for the new Most Motivated Collection Partner (or BMOP Rock Star) category.

“These stores go out of their way to motivate their employees by offering additional incentives,” said Kiscaden. “Because of them we see an uptick in mercury thermostat collections that always coincide with the contest.”

Also new this year is the Best Smack Talk Video category. Participants challenge the competition by producing their own video and sending it to TRC by September 1st! Videos must be under one minute, fun, and in good taste. Submissions will be sent to TRC’s entire contest distribution list, and posted on social media. The wholesaler with the best video is announced at the HARDI Annual Conference in Vegas and receives a special prize!

“While BMOP makes things fun, the real point behind competition is to increase collections of mercury thermostats,” explained Kiscaden. “We believe these improvements to the competition will help us see greater numbers than ever before.”

BMOP encourages HARDI members to promote TRC’s mercury thermostat collection program at their branches. To accommodate distributors of all sizes, three winning wholesalers will be determined as follows: the one that recycles the most pounds of mercury overall, the one that recycles the highest average pounds of mercury, and the one with the highest branch participation rate (for distributors with more than 10 locations). Additionally, a \$500 store incentive will be awarded to the top three branch locations that recycle the most.

Winners will be recognized at HARDI’s annual conference, Dec. 2-5 in Las Vegas, Nevada. HARDI distributors may sign up to compete in all BMOP categories at www.thermostat-recycle.org/BMOP.
